Strengthening Awareness on Transgender Rights and Inclusion

Advancing the vision of an inclusive society, Sewa International organised a one-day awareness and capacity-building programme in Dhalai district, Tripura and Barmer in Rajasthan. Held in partnership with NISD under the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment at Govt. Degree College, the session focused on the Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Act, 2019 and Rules, 2020. Participants gained clarity on legal rights, welfare schemes, and institutional support systems available for transgender persons. The programme reinforced the importance of dignity, equality, and social inclusion in nation-building.

Sewa International continues to work towards creating informed communities that uphold the rights and dignity of every individual.

Sewa Shakti Saahas Empowers Women in Poonch

Marking a significant step in community resilience, Sewa International launched the Sewa Shakti Saahas programme in Poonch, Jammu & Kashmir, in collaboration with Sewa Bharti J&K and Shakti Udghosh Foundation. Over 120 girls and women completed a 10-day training in self-defence and basic disaster management, building confidence and first-responder readiness. The programme concluded with certificate distribution in the presence of senior officials, medical professionals, and SDRF teams who encouraged leadership and preparedness. Supported by local administration and expert trainers, the initiative strengthened safety awareness in India's border regions.

Guiding Women Entrepreneurs Towards Government-Supported Livelihoods

In Rudraprayag district, Uttarakhand, aspirations took shape as local entrepreneurs came together to explore pathways to self-reliance. Sewa International, in collaboration with the District Industries Department, organised an entrepreneurship development workshop for SHG members from Agastyamuni and Jakholi blocks in Uttarakhand under the Oracle Project. The session provided practical guidance on government schemes, enterprise options, and financial support under Mukhyamantri Swarozgar Yojana 2.0. 15 women participants took a confident step forward by expressing interest in availing loans and submitting required documents.

Sewa International continues to strengthen grassroots entrepreneurship by enabling women to transform skills into sustainable livelihoods.



Empowering Girls Through Knowledge and Care: Sanitary Pads Distribution in Karnataka



In the classrooms of Mandya district, young voices found the courage to speak about what is often left unspoken. Sewa International conducted Menstrual Hygiene Management sessions at GHPS Taggahalli and GHPS Kallahalli Badavane, Karnataka, reaching adolescent girls. The sessions created a safe space to address myths, promote healthy practices, and build confidence around menstrual health. To support this journey, 150 free cloth sanitary napkins were distributed, ensuring access to safe and sustainable care.

Building Courage Through Self-Defence Training




Strengthening community safety, Sewa International, in collaboration with the LP Emergency Response Team (LP-ERT), successfully organised a Sewa Shakti Saahas self-defence training session. The programme engaged 65 participants, including children, men, and women, fostering inclusivity and collective preparedness. Participants were trained in practical self-defence techniques aimed at ensuring personal safety during emergencies. The session also focused on building confidence, courage, and situational awareness.

Inspiring Young Minds Through Science Exposure



Sewa International organised a Science Museum exposure visit for 200 government school students, with active participation from 70 corporate volunteers. Supported by TGBS, the visit offered students hands-on learning experiences at the National Science Centre through science demonstrations and 3D shows. To extend learning beyond the visit, 200 STEM kits were distributed to participating students. The interaction between students and volunteers made science learning engaging and aspirational.

Sewa International continues to bridge classroom learning with real-world exposure through meaningful corporate partnerships.

Fueling Dreams Through Corporate Volunteer Engagement



Bringing generations together through service, Sewa International organised the Fueling Dreams- Empowering Generations volunteer engagement activity at a government school in Greater Noida. The initiative reached 146 students with SEEK school kits while corporate volunteers engaged children through drawing activities on health, water, and school life. The day concluded with a cultural programme where students and volunteers participated together, strengthening bonds beyond the classroom. A total of 32 corporate volunteers, 10 teachers, and community members contributed to making the event meaningful.

Sewa International continues to foster shared responsibility by connecting corporate volunteers with grassroots education initiatives.

Umeedo Ki Udaan: When Hope Finds Its Way

The third Umeedo Ki Udaan distribution unfolded not as an event, but as a series of quiet, heartfelt moments across Kutch. With the support of Udaan Mitra- Smt. Debu Ben ji, SEEK school kits were personally handed to children in Bhachau, Dholavira, and Rapar, reaching those who needed them most. Each handover carried more than supplies- it carried reassurance, dignity, and the joy of being seen. From shy smiles to excited runs, every child's response reminded us why this journey matters.

Our Sewa Fellows: Stories from the Grassroots



After completing her Fellowship jourmey last year, Kalyani, who hails from Satara, chose the Bastis of Pune as her Karmabhumi . During the fellowship, she was placed at Swaroopwardhinee , and everything she learned there- along with the experiences she gained further strengthened her desire to work in in these bastis.

For the past one year, she has been teaching children across 8 Bastis in Pune through the organization she founded, called Jayatu Social Foundation. While she is full of motivation and

passion for this work, she also faces several challenges. Yet, with strong determination, she continues to push her work forward.

Not only this- Kalyani now has her own office for Jayatu Social Foundation in Pune, which she received through a donation. And in order to run the work in a more structured way, she has also hired a coordinator two months ago.

As of this month, she has already started discussions in nearly 30 Bastis to expand the Foundation's work. She believes that by next year, Jayatu Social Foundation will be actively working in 22 Bastis.
